Charles B. Sperow, Jr. was born in Martinsburg and raised on a dairy farm. He was active in 4-H as a youth. He was a National 4-H Scholarship Winner and 1949 International Farm Youth Exchange representative to Sweden. He graduated from West Virginia University with B.S. and M.S. degrees in 1952 and 1958. Upon graduation, he was hired by the University as Assistant Agronomist and Superintendent of the Ohio Valley Experiment Station.

In the 1960's, Mr. Sperow was in Uganda on a WVU-USAID contract as a lecturer in soils and agricultural chemistry. Since 1971, he has been an Extension Specialist in Agronomy at West Virginia University, and was promoted to Professor in 1974.

Professor Sperow was Northeastern Branch of Agronomy in 1983. He has received numerous professional honors, including the Extension Service's Outstanding Award. He was recently inducted into the Extension Professionals Hall of Fame. He has participated in shortcourses, workshops, and has authored numerous bulletins, circulars and fact sheets.
