

CHARLES H. ALLEN, JR.

Charles H. Allen, Jr. was born at Sinks Grove, West Virginia. He earned a bachelor's degree in education from Marshall University and a masters degree from West Virginia University. He devoted 36 years to education in West Virginia, serving as teacher, principal, coach and county superintendent of schools. During all this time, he was a part-time farmer, who also did custom hay baling and sheep shearing. After retiring, he expanded his farming operation to 500 acres of pasture, silage and hayland, which he owns and rents. He has been a pioneer in using performance-tested sires. His farming and livestock production practices have served as good demonstrations in his area.

Mr. Allen has been active in the West Virginia Cattlemen's Association since 1973. He served as Director for two years. Monroe County organized one of the first county associations which became affiliated with the West Virginia Cattlemen's Association. He has been a member, director, president and secretary of this association, which has served as a model for the rest of the State in developing educational enterprises.



West Virginia had the first cattle producer check-off of \$1 per head donated to promotion and research in beef cattle. Charles Allen was a pioneer and leader in this program.

Mr. Allen has served with distinction on the College of Agriculture and Forestry Visiting Committee for a number of years, including a term as chair. His leadership and vision have been invaluable.
